OCA Seminaries Welcome New Students for the 2024-25 Academic Year

The 2024-25 academic year has begun at Saint Vladimir's Orthodox Theological Seminary, Yonkers, NY, Saint Herman's Orthodox Theological Seminary, Kodiak, AK, and Saint Tikhon's Orthodox Theological Seminary, South Canaan, PA.

St. Vladimir's Seminary

St. Vladimir's Orthodox Theological Seminary (SVOTS) began its 2024 Fall Semester on Thursday, August 22, with a Moleben for the Beginning of the New Academic Year. His Beatitude Metropolitan Tikhon presided at the moleben. He encouraged the new students to approach their studies with dedication and humility. Interim President and Academic Dean, Dr. Ionuţ-Alexandru Tudorie, also addressed the incoming class of 32 students, commending their commitment, leaving behind comfortable careers and homes, to pursue studies at seminary.

His Beatitude Metropolitan Tikhon Visits His Eminence Metropolitan Saba

On September 12, 2024 His Beatitude Metropolitan Tikhon, along with Archpriest Alexander Rentel, Chancellor of the Orthodox Church in America, and Protodeacon Peter Ilchuk visited His Eminence Metropolitan Saba at the chancery of the Antiochian Orthodox Christian Archdiocese of North America in Englewood, NJ. This visit marked their first official meeting since His Eminence's election in February 2023 and his enthronement as Archbishop of New York and Metropolitan of the Antiochian Orthodox Christian Archdiocese.

Also in attendance were Fr. Joseph Samaan, the Protosyngellos of the Antiochian Archdiocese, and Fr. Thomas Zain, Vicar General of the Antiochian Archdiocese. The meeting included discussions on various topics affecting the Orthodox Church in North America, such as the upcoming meeting of the Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops later this month, the ongoing work of the Assembly, and seminary education.

During the meeting, His Beatitude expressed gratitude for the collaboration between the OCA and the Antiochian Archdiocese, acknowledging the contributions of clergy such as Fr. Jeremy Davis at St. Vladimir's Seminary. His Beatitude also took the opportunity to discuss upcoming plans for the canonization of Matushka Olga.

The meeting concluded with a discussion of potential dates for a joint concelebration of the Divine Liturgy.

After the meeting, His Beatitude and the delegation joined His Eminence for dinner, where they continued their discussions on a wide variety of topics which enabled them to get to know each other better.

His Beatitude also presented copies of the new edition of the Holy Psalter, a joint publication by STM Press and SVS Press, as gifts to His Eminence and the Antiochian Archdiocese.

Master of Theology (Th.M.), and Doctor of Ministry (D.Min.) programs. The incoming students join the SVOTS student body for a total of 95 students.

In addition to welcoming new students, St. Vladimir's introduced new faculty members and staff, including Assistant Director of Chapel Music and Director of Admissions Mr. Zachariah Mandell and Rev. Dn. Dr. Harrison Basil Russin, who is serving as Associate Dean for Residential Life in addition to his position as Assistant Professor of Liturgical Music.

St. Tikhon's Seminary

On Monday, August 26, 2024, St. Tikhon's Orthodox Theological Seminary (STOTS) welcomed its incoming Class of 2027, consisting of 15 first-year seminarians from five different dioceses of the Orthodox Church in America, the Antiochian Archdiocese, and the Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church. His Eminence Archbishop Michael of New York and New Jersey, Rector of St. Tikhon's, led the orientation sessions along with the Dean and Director of Student Life, V. Rev. John Parker, and Rev. Ignatius Gauvain.

For the first time, the seminary also held a "Family Orientation" on August 22-23, giving spouses and children of the seminarians an opportunity to meet the community and learn about life at the seminary. The event concluded with a Southern BBQ Night, encouraging fellowship among the families and the wider seminary community.

The week of orientation also included the annual Fall Beautification project, during which students worked together to prepare the campus for the new academic year. This year's effort was particularly special, as it added the finishing touches to extensive renovations across the campus, including updates to dormitory housing, the library, gymnasium, and soon-to-be-finished fitness center.

St. Herman's Seminary

St. Herman's Seminary in Kodiak, AK, began its academic year with an All-Night Vigil for the Dormition of the Theotokos on the evening of August 27, continuing into the morning of August 28.

Following the Vigil, the community enjoyed a beach picnic before resuming orientation activities later on August 29. Matins began the day, followed by orientation led by the V. Rev. Annual Lecture in Broadview Heights Welcomes Archbishop of New York

Archangel Michael Church, Broadview Heights, OH, held its annual Fr. Vladimir Memorial Lecture, on Tuesday, September 17th. His Eminence Archbishop Michael of New York and the Diocese of New York and New Jersey was the guest speaker and presented a talk entitled, "The Road to Nicaea: Factors Leading to the Convening of the First Ecumenical Council." His Eminence discussed how Christ is revealed to us through His Holy Church, the Scriptures, the Sacraments, and by Holy Tradition.

He then went on to categorize misinterpretations which led to heretical concepts and divisions that rocked the Church, as well as its need to come together in unity to unify and codify our Christology into the Creed.

Over sixty persons participated in this unique and "interactive" event. Following the lecture, an impromptu, but impassioned plea was made to collect donations for one of Archbishop Michael's parishes, St. Olympia Orthodox Church in Norwood, NY, which suffered severe storm and flood damage during the last hurricane. \$768 was collected and presented to the Archbishop.

The icon was received that evening by Archpriest Zachariah Trent, Rector. An Akathist was sung before the icon and the faithful had the chance to venerate the most holy Theotokos and offer their prayers before her. Alexander also gave a brief history of the icon at Holy Trinity Cathedral, Chicago, IL, and reminded those gathered that despite the large size of the diocese, every time we gaze upon a copy of the Tikhvin icon, we are brought closer together in our mission to serve the Lord.

The visitation of the icon is a part of the 20th anniversary celebration that is taking place throughout the year in the diocese. Award Given at Minneapolis Cathedral

During an archpastoral visit to the Twin Cities, His Eminence Archbishop Daniel of Chicago and the Midwest presented the Dean of St Mary's cathedral with a Mitre at Great Vespers on September 14. His Eminence spoke on behalf of the Holy Synod of the Orthodox Church in America, which granted Fr Andrew Morbey the right to wear the mitre at its Spring session.

In his remarks, Archbishop Daniel gave an overview of the history of the mitre as a clergy award and the spiritual significance of this award being made on the Feast of the Elevation of the Cross. The newly Mitred Archpriest Andrew reflected on the ways in which this award shares important common themes with the crowns of an Orthodox marriage: stewardship, perseverance, martyrdom.
